Rotating Drum Screens for Farm Turnouts

For several years now, the WID has been installing a rotating drum water screen on farm turnout structures to producer pumpwells. These screens, on rotating drums, eliminate most of the debris such as moss, aquatic weeds, branches and leaves, plus human trash, that otherwise could plug irrigation system pumps, pipes, or nozzles.

To clear debris and/or trash, water is pumped through a spray bar with nozzles providing a flat spray at approximately 40 psi, back through the screen basically blowing off the debris back into the main stream. The screen is stainless steel that resembles a very strong window screen.

Drum and screen size is determined by the size of the irrigation pumping unit.



The WID designed the precast turnout structure with a basin deep enough to lower the screening unit into. An arm with a hand crank winch is provided to lower and raise the unit as needed for maintenance or just to keep it out of the water if not being used. The basin is situated below the canal bed meaning a check structure is not required in the canal to raise water levels and pumping units can be operated at low water levels.

The screen is lowered into the water when in use. It is only raised for maintenance etc.
